Raymond Meyer Memorial Scholarship

The Raymond Meyer Flight Scholarship was created for two primary reasons. First, to remember Raymond Meyer as an Oregon Aviator with a passion for flying and for sharing that passion with others. Second, to continue to promote aviation, like Raymond, by enabling the opportunity of learning to fly by providing financial assistance.

This year's scholarship is \$2,000

Eligibility Criteria	Awarding & Accounting
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must be at least 16 years old.• Must be a resident of Oregon.• Member of Oregon Pilots Association (student membership is free).• Must have successfully soloed in an airplane.• Passage of FAA Private Pilot Knowledge Test before funds will be released.• Minimum 2.5 GPA if enrolled in High School or College.• GED completion or High School graduation if not currently enrolled.• Submission of an essay explaining why you want to learn to fly or acquire an advanced rating and how the scholarship would help in attaining that goal.• Submission of completed application and requested information on application.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Applications will be accepted March 1, 2021 through May 1, 2021.• Scholarship winner will be announced early June, 2021.• Scholarship funds to be deposited with the selected FBO or flight instructor to be used exclusively for aircraft rental and/or flight instruction.• Funds may ONLY be used for private pilot license or advanced ratings.• The FBO or flight instructor must provide a detailed accounting of all expenditures.• Any scholarship funds not used for their intended purpose within one year of the award date must be returned unless an extension request in writing has been approved by the scholarship committee. The committee decision to grant or deny is final.
